



# AISI Learning Goals

As a parent I am sure you have asked the question, “What did you DO at school today?” You probably got an answer such as:

- Not much.
- Nothing.
- We played \_\_\_\_\_ in gym.

What if the question was changed to, “What did you LEARN today at school?”

Or even more specifically,

“What did you learn about in math, social, science, etc?”

By talking about students goals in learning, it helps them to take ownership over their own learning. Presenting learning outcomes in student friendly language is an area that we have been working on at Greentree School.

*For example, at the beginning of a math lesson the teacher may say, “We are learning about patterns. Our goal today is ‘I can create a repeating pattern with 3 different colours.’ Let’s get out our attribute blocks . . .*
